### Commission presents New Initiatives for Digital Infrastructures of Tomorrow

The Commission has presented a set of possible actions to foster the innovation, security, and resilience of digital infrastructures. ### European Commission wants a Deadline for Copper Decommissioning in the future Digital Networks Act (DNA)

The next review of the European regulatory framework for electronic communications could contain a deadline for copper decommissioning by 2028–2030, a dispute resolution mechanism as part of the network contribution debate, and a single EU-level authorisation regime for core networks. In addition, it could contain more EU-level spectrum management and a relaxation of the ex-ante regulation of fibre. **Cullen International** (read more – subscription required)
